
主席的話

勿掉起初的愛心

上次踏足三藩市已經是 18 年前,而溫哥華卻是第一次。今次隨兩位弟兄一起將祝福和鼓勵帶給當地華人教會,向青少年工作者及家長分享新一代的牧養。

我們驚奇地發現香港、北美兩地的華人青年共通性甚多,正是兩地可以交流和共享心得的起點。今天教會大量流失青年,家庭關係愈來愈緊張,值得我們反思青年工作。我們分享的不單是經驗技巧,而是一顆「初心」—— 為何要服侍青年人的心。有些北美教會走型格路線,為了吸引青年人,在崇拜運用 rock music、音效、燈光煙火;華人家長吹捧功能主義,重視「搵到食」而忽略了建立關係和價值觀。就讓我們一起重新想像和反思青年工作的核心價值,如以弗所教會要警醒的,勿掉起初的愛心。

The Call of North America

Exodus of youths from the church does not only happen in Hong Kong, but also exists in San Jose and Vancouver. We responded to the call of these two cities by conducting workshops for parents and youth workers in October 2015. We explored together the dignity of life, cultural living, media literacy, spiritual growth, and life calling among the youth. We expounded Psalm 8 as God's creational mandate; from Ephesian 3 to see a national calling of a generation of American Chinese youth in North America; from 1 Peter 2:9 to see the importance of collective and communal identities; and from Mark 10:17-22 the rich young ruler dialogue with Jesus to breakthrough a self-centered life. Andrew Choi and Ringo Ng then illustrated the practical steps to dialogue with youths on spiritual

growth. Many parents and youth workers found hope within workshops, rekindling their sense of significance in youth work.

We shared our ministry framework with pastoral conference core team, using creation theology. We also preached in two churches on how to pastor youths from Genesis 1-2 story. We felt the sense of crisis and helplessness by the pastors in North America towards the exodus of youth. Most of the workshops were videotaped, ready for future distribution with group discussion questions to bless more people.





Don't lose the heart

It was 18 years ago when I first came to San Francisco but this is my very first time I set foot in Vancouver. Together with two other brothers, I hope to bring blessings and encouragement to local Chinese churches. At the same time we would like share with youth workers and parents how to pastor the new generation.

Surprisingly we have found that the youths of Hong Kong and North America have a lot in common. This is a very good starting point for both places to interact and share with each other. The churches today are losing a lot of young people. The family relationship has become tense. These make us reflect on our youth ministry in a serious manner. What we are sharing is not only experiential techniques, but "a heart of origin": a heart asking ourselves why we need to serve the youth. Some North American churches choose the trendy way in order to attract young people. They use rock music, sound effects, lighting and fireworks. Chinese parents encourage functionalism, emphasize in making money but neglect the importance of relationship building and value system. Let us all renew our imagination and reflect upon the core value of youth ministry again. Like what the Ephesian church needed to be aware of: Don't lose the heart!



Nurturing the Digital Generation

I had the opportunity to visit San Jose and Vancouver with Wing Tai and Ringo in Oct. We conducted a series of workshops called "Nurturing the New Generation". In Vancouver, we partnered with Trinity Western University MinistryLift for the first time to offer a parenting workshop on how to build up youth's self-esteem, and a youth workers' workshop on nurturing the digital generation, fulfilling the mission of God's Kingdom. The workshops were well received and we recorded them as video lessons for churches later, hoping to equip more parents and youth workers.

During this trip we had the chance to share with local pastors, ministry workers, parents and youth workers. They all pointed out if the Chinese Churches don't want to risk losing the young generation, we must prepare to respond to the need of this digital generation, equip them with the holistic gospel, engage them to be the Kingdom of God's people, and live out their faith daily. We also emphasized the importance of cross-generation mentorship.

Lastly, we would like to appreciate the warm hospitality by the local brothers and sisters.
