

## Anti-epidemic Measures (Updated on 6 October 2022)

To fight against the COVID-19 and to safeguard the health of our service users, we require your cooperation in perusing and complying with the following anti-epidemic measures that being set in accordance with Prevention and Control of Disease (Requirements and Directions) (Business and Premises) Regulation (Cap. 599F):

- 1. The responsible applicant has to sign and return the 'Prevention of COVID-19 Reminder to Person In-charge of Organizations' and the 'Group Health Declaration Form' for his/her group upon check-
- 2. On the day of arrival, anyone who is infected, close contact, or undergoing isolation, home quarantine or medical surveillance as instructed by the Government, or whose Vaccine Pass is with a Red Code or an Amber Code, he/she is not permitted to enter into the Village. All payment will not be refunded.
- 3. During the check-in, our staff will remind the person-in-charge the measures of preventing COVID-19. All campers are required to take temperature.
- 4. All campers are required to wear a surgical mask in the premises of the Village.
- 5. All campers are required to maintain appropriate social distance with other people as far as possible.
- 6. During the stay, if member(s) of your organization is observed to have infectious symptoms, please immediately arrange the member(s) to conduct the RAT. Once a positive result is observed, the member, the close contacts or even the whole group is/are required to leave the Village immediately in order to protect the other group members and our service users. All payment will not be refunded.
- 7. The maximum capacity allowed for all multi-purpose function venues is 85%.
- 8.  $\leq$ 12 may be allowed in each guest room, and  $\leq$ 24 persons may be allowed to stay in a suite.
- 9. All our camp quarters are in the zone of 'Scheduled Premises', campers MUST scan the "LeaveHomeSafe" (LHS) venue QR code once he/she enters the room of camp quarters.
- 10. All persons entering the Dining Hall and Sport Facilities must comply with the COVID-19 vaccination requirements under Vaccine Pass, except under exempted scenarios.
- 11. All campers are encouraged to conduct the RAT within the preceding 24 hours and daily, for residential camp, during the camp period. Campers should prepare their own RAT kit.
- 12. Periodic sanitization has been carrying out for public facilities. •
- 13. Carpet sprayed with sanitizer was placed at our main entrance. Hand sanitizer is provided at various location in the Village.
- 14. At Dining Hall, the maximum number of persons allowed to be seated together at one table or one zone with effective partition is 12.
- 15. All campers MUST complete the following steps before entering our Dining Hall:
  - i. scan the LHS venue QR and Vaccine Pass;
  - ii. screen of body temperature; and
  - any group more than 12 participants entering the Dining Hall must present a photo showing iii. the Rapid Antigen Test (RAT) kit with negative result (on which the customer's name as well as the date and time of taking the RAT are marked) of a test conducted within the preceding 24 hours, or a SMS message showing the polymerase chain reaction based nucleic acid (PCR) test with negative result within the preceding 48 hours.
- 16. Dining Hall provides serving chopsticks and serving spoons.
- 17. Cleansing will be carried out before and after use for all activity rooms.
